

Job 38: 1-7, (34-41); Psalm 104: 1-9, 24, 35c; Hebrews 5:1-10; Mark 10:35-45

The Request of James and John



James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.'

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

SOME THOUGHTS

Rather than giving us a plan for what a perfect society should be, Jesus gave us a process, a way of hearing, a way of looking behind the world of appearances.

A way to press forward to the truth. This is called the journey into contemplation.

We live in a society that is highly dependent on our earning what we believe we are worth.

We continually must find an opportunity to tell ourselves and others that we are valuable.

We do this through the clothes we wear or the car we drive.

But we have difficulty finding our value from within. We have projected our sense of worth almost exclusively onto things.

It would be fair to say that we find it hard to know our own centre or to live from within it. We live in an affluent society expecting more and wanting more.

But the more we own the less we enjoy. The more we project our longing onto things, the more things disappoint us.

We live in a society in which we have access to what are called timesaving devices. And yet, the thing we seem to lack the most is 'TIME'. We have much more information but less wisdom.

Hence our social system may produce many specialists, but very few wise men and women.

And in the end, we are short of knowledge, wisdom and time.

When the soul is projected outward, we have less time for love, because other people turn into articles for consumption too. We keep asking only: what can this person do for me?

How can this person be useful to me? That's why there are so few experiences of genuine friendship that's grounded in itself, with no goal above and beyond the relationship.

It is also no surprise that we have little notion of the spiritual life.

Wisdom is a renowned grace, one of the first graces noted over and over in the Old Testament.

Wisdom is among the most essential graces of the human experience.

Contemplation, a significant consequence of wisdom, is the search for a wide-open space.

This space is broad enough for the head to have room enough in it. It is broad enough for the

heart, the feelings, the gut, the subconscious, our memories, our intuitions, in fact for the whole body.

A holistic place for hearing the will of the Father. To discern that will, we must remove our attachment to our own will, so that we can recognise the difference between the two.

To discern God's will we need to spend time with him.

In the words of the psalmist, 'O god, you are my God, earnestly I seek you my soul thirsts for you....... (Ps 63:10)
